Valerie and I were shocked beyond belief at the news video of a teen-aged relative that thought it'd be a cool idea to teach his little 4- and 5-year-old nephews to smoke drugs! As if that were not bad enough, he even had the nerve to videotape his actions and post the footage on the Internet. Now that teenager is in jail, the children are in foster care, the mother is being ridiculed and those of us with a lick of sense are outraged!

You know, it got me thinking about the fact that we're all teaching others something in our lives. Some, (*and I believe this is most of us*), are teaching good lessons to others by setting a good Christian example before them. But then there are others, knowingly and otherwise, that are teaching terrible and harmful lessons by the lives that they live! Some of the most severe criticism from the Lord came toward those who were supposed to be teachers of morality and religion among the Jews. Regarding those who teach others the wrong way in life, our Lord would say, "*...It is better that a millstone were hanged about his neck and he be cast into the sea, than that he should cause one of these little ones to stumble.*" (**Luke 17:2**)
